## SPIRITUAL RETREAT

We have scheduled a Spiritual Retreat for our congregation at the St. Francis Retreat Center in Dewitt, Michigan. It will be held Friday, May 20 from 7:00-9:30 p.m. and Saturday May 21 from 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. This retreat will be led by Rev. Jim Williams. His wife, Rev. Linda Williams, will help facilitate the sessions. Both pastors have extensive experience in leading spiritual retreats. Unlike the previous retreat that we had last year,

this retreat will NOT be about leadership, finances, church growth, or any other of the practical issues of the church. This retreat is about reconnecting with God on a deeper level. The description below has been provided by the Revs. Williams regarding the retreat. The cost is \$75, which includes lodging and meals for the two days. You may sign up for the retreat by seeing Nancy Lewis. Also, if you wish to sponsor another participant who may not be able to afford the cost, please inform Nancy when you sign up. People frequently lack focus because they live in bondage to complexities. The purpose of simplicity is to cultivate an inner awareness which becomes expressed outwardly in a lifestyle. Simplicity is not shallow, although it can become that. It is not withdrawal, although it can become that. Simplicity is knowing what comes first and living with clarity because of that knowledge. The discipline of simplicity helps people focus on seeking the Kingdom of God's reign and its righteousness. That focus will put everything else in its proper order. It frees people from the complexities that society encourages. The discipline of simplicity leads people to buy things for their usefulness, not for their status. It helps people identify addictions. It might even lead to giving away possessions. It can help people enjoy things without owning them. God offers the courage and insight for each of us to live a simple life. The simplicity of knowing this can be freeing.

To help anyone who is interested in simplifying their life will be the main focus of the retreat. The retreat will begin at 7 PM on Friday night with an introductory period followed by opening devotions. The retreat will contain an introduction to Spiritual practices focusing on obstacles to prayer and some suggestions as how they might be overcome. There will be informal bible study, small group discussion, periods for silent reflection and prayer and a closing worship service of healing and communion.

Friday night's session will last from 7 - 9:30 PM and Saturday will begin with optional morning prayer at 7:30 AM with breakfast at 8 AM in the fellowship hall and morning devotions beginning at 9 AM. The retreat will conclude with a service of healing and communion at 3 PM on Saturday afternoon.

# **BYLAWS CHANGE**

The Church Council is currently required by our bylaws to meet on the third Thursday of each month. Because there are occasional conflicts that prevent members from attending on the prescribed Thursday, the church leadership is requesting a bylaws change to allow for flexibility in the day on which the Council meets. Below you will find the current language, followed by the requested change.

Current bylaw language:

# ARTICLE IV B3 (A)


The church council shall meet monthly **on the 3rd Thursday of each month** except the months when a quarterly meeting is held. In those months, a council meeting is optional as determined by the moderator.

Requested change:

This bylaws change will be voted on at the April 28, 2016, Quarterly Business Meeting.

January, and people who didn't believe the change were called April fools.

April Fools' Day may also be connected to the lightheartedness that comes with warmer weather, as well as to medieval Christian festivals that involved pranks, disguises and a temporarily inverted social order.

Yet, in Scripture, such reversal characterizes the kingdom of God. In 1 Corinthians 1:18-25, St. Paul writes that the gospel seems foolish to people who don't know Christ, that God uses the "foolishness of our proclamation" to offer salvation to all and that God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom. Jesus "foolishly" inverted the social order, saying the last will be first and the first, last.

So if on April 1 - and every day - we live as "fools for Christ," we are precisely what he calls us to be!
