Dear Congregation,

As your Finance Team leader, it is necessary that I communicate with the congregation from time to time about the financial health and status of the church. This is an extremely sensitive subject and difficult to address. On one hand, our purpose here is to be a people of God, to spread the Gospel, to be disciples of Christ. On the other hand, any organization, no matter what form it takes, can only be functional by being diligent and responsible with the resources God has provided.

Although we as a people of God are responsible with the resources he provides, we do not hoard resources and yet we do not overspend resources. It is important for you, as a member of the Body of Christ, know the struggles we face. Due to the decline in attendance over the last ten years, we can no longer meet our present needs. We are able to operate on a contribution of income that is being provided by our endowments and general offerings from you.

As I have said in previous Annual Reports, we can no longer sustain expenditures beyond our means. Here is when it becomes sensitive. Some people are encouraged by gentle reminders to give as much as they can, while others say, 'Here we go again...they're asking for more money'. How do you find the middle ground? You don't.

So here it is. After all necessary costs have been reduced to a bare minimum; we are still in a heavy deficit situation. Even with our endowments, we are not meeting the financial necessities anymore. The endowments will be used more heavily overtime and eventually will be gone. Once that happens, there will be no resources left to keep the church doors opened. Preparations will need to be made prior to this happening. It is obvious that this affects our pastoral search as well. Please be in personal and spiritual preparation for this.

My hope and prayers are that God will turn this around. In the meantime, the Finance Team will begin to meet more frequently to address the actions needed for the future. Please consider these words and think about what you can do to be a part of change for our future. Please be in daily prayer about this. I welcome any suggestions.

HELP NEEDED

When I've taken sacred vows -baptism, marriage, ordination or as part of a congregation committing to support the just-baptized or new teachers - I've felt genuine gratitude for words such as these in the ceremony: "May God, who gives you the will to make these promises, also give you the power to perform them." I'm relieved God doesn't leave me on my own to fulfill what is easier said than done.

Adults who guide youngsters can follow God's lead by committing to this kind of help. For example, my young son often declares, "I promise!" about a requested behavior. He means it, but when distractions arise or energy sags, when he's hungry or tired or frustrated, when the task feels overwhelming ... he needs help obeying or delivering on his promise. As a parent, I can say, "Let's do it together," or "How about setting the timer and doing the job in 10 minutes?" or "Afterward, we can play."

God doesn't leave us to rely on our own power. Likewise, adults can pledge inwardly to children: "May I, who have motivated you to promise this, also help you perform it."

On a computer screen, images can be magnified to show tiny details and make text easier to read. In the process, however, the "big picture" is lost. After checking various aspects of a project closely, it's a good idea to "zoom out" again to be sure everything still looks as it should.

Likewise, it's easy to fixate on the tiny details of our lives (especially flaws in ourselves and others). We tend to enlarge our problems far beyond their actual size and totally miss problems taking a toll elsewhere. We may also forget the beautiful "big picture" of God's care encompassing us. After tending to life's details, it's important to take a broader view to see whether our up-close perceptions hold true when we gaze on the work as a whole.

"Help us 'zoom out,' oh God," prays Joshua DuBois in *The President's Devotional* (HarperOne). "Widen our perspective and extend our horizon, so that we can more fully know your purpose this day, and every day."

Planning a summer trip? Take along a scripture passage befitting your vacation to use for devotions and prayer time (all NIV below):

- In the mountains: "The mountains and hills will burst into song before you" (Isaiah 55:12).
- At a lake, perhaps on a fishing trip: "They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. 'Come, follow me,' Jesus said, 'and I will send you out to fish for people" (Matthew 4:18-19).
- Near an ocean or river: "Let the sea resound ... let the rivers clap their hands" (Psalm 98:7-8).
- In the desert: "They looked toward the desert, and there was the glory of the LORD appearing in the cloud" (Exodus 16:10).
- In the woods: "Blessed is the one ... whose delight is in the law of the LORD ... That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season" (Psalm 1:1-3).
- In the flatlands: "My food,' said Jesus, 'is to do the will of him who sent me ... I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest" (John 4:34-35).
- On a "staycation" close to home: "Love the LORD your God ... These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. ... Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road ... Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates" (Deuteronomy 6:5-9).


