# **REQUESTED BYLAWS CHANGES**

Due to dwindling membership and some potential important upcoming votes, the church is requesting some constitution and bylaws changes. Specifically, the requested changes eliminate the minimum number of votes cast and tighten the requirements for active membership. Below are the requested changes:

#### **CONSTITUTION**

ARTICLE X. Amendments 2B

Current language: An amendment, to be adopted, requires three-quarters (3/4) vote of members present and voting, providing at least twenty-five (25) votes are cast.

**Requested new language**: An amendment, to be adopted, requires three-quarters (3/4) vote of **active** members present and voting. (Eliminate the 25 votes requirement; add the word "active")

#### **BYLAWS**

ARTICLE I. Admission/Classification of Members 2A1)

Current language: 1) Active List. This list shall be made up of members who fulfill at least one of the following criteria: (unless prevented by personal circumstances subject to the review and approval of the Worship Team.)

a) attend servicesb) share in various duties of the churchc) assume some portion of the financial obligation of the church

**Requested new language**: 1) Active List. This list shall be made up of members who fulfill at least one of the following criteria: (unless prevented by personal circumstances subject to the review and approval of the Worship Team.

a) attend a minimum of six services per year

b) assist with the responsibilities of church activities

#### ARTICLE II. PASTORATE B. The Call

Current language: 4) A vote of three-fourths of the members present and qualified to vote shall be necessary to extend a call (providing there be twenty-five (25) members present and voting--see Article IX, Section 2). **Requested new language**: A vote of three-fourths of the **active** members present and qualified to vote shall be necessary to extend a call. (Eliminate the 25 votes requirement; add the word "active")

#### ARTICLE II. PASTORATE B3. Termination of the Pastorate

Current language: 2) Valid termination of said office may be made by a vote of three-fourths of the members present and qualified to vote, provided there be twenty-five (25) qualified members present to vote and voting (see Article VIII, Section 2).

**Requested new language**: Valid termination of said office may be made by a vote of three-fourths of the **active** members present and qualified to vote. (**Eliminate the 25 votes requirement; add the word ''active''**)

#### ARTICLE VII: ELECTIONS/VOTING PROCEDURES 2. Qualification of Voters

Current language: All matters pertaining to the purchase, sale or mortgaging of Church property shall be by paper ballot and be voted by a 2/3 majority, provided at least 25 votes yea or nay are cast. A minimum of 25 active members in good standing, who are of legal age, shall be the quorum required to vote on these matters.

**Requested new language:** All matters pertaining to the purchase, sale or mortgaging of Church property shall be by paper ballot and must be approved by a 2/3 majority of the **active** members present and voting who are of legal age. (Eliminate the 25 votes requirement; add the word "active")

These changes will be voted on at the next Quarterly Business Meeting, scheduled for October 27, 2016.


## **CROP HUNGER WALK OFFERING**

#### ALWAYS VALUED

When Paul talks about treasure in clay jars (2 Corinthians 4:6-9), he's referring to the gospel message. The apostle compares the human carriers of the treasure, including himself, to breakable vessels that aren't impervious to outside influences and can fail. But that causes the carriers to rely on God's strength when facing afflictions.

Part of the usefulness of the image and Paul knows this - is that broken clay jars were used as blank "pages" for writing letters, business receipts, invitations to meals and weddings, and so on. He emphasizes that even when we're broken, we're useful in God's kingdom. When we feel defeated by failure, Jesus still considers us valuable.

#### I SHALL NOT NEED

Despite the traditional wording ("The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want"), Psalm 23 declares that God provides everything we *need* - not everything we desire.

"He makes me lie down" ... Sometimes our busyness is useful; other times it is how we feel in control or superior to others. God knows we need to rest and sometimes must make us do so!

"He leads me beside still waters" ... Although we often prefer noisy distractions, God knows we need quiet to hear him and have our souls restored.

"You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies." Rather than a boast ("Ha! See how God spreads a banquet in my honor while others look on!"), this is a reminder that God wants us to dine with our enemies. We might not be able to stand those people, but God pursues reconciliation.

In the process, **"goodness and mercy** ... follow me all ... my life." That's what we need the most.




