Dear Members and Friends,

On Palm Sunday we had the privilege of witnessing four teenagers and one adult publicly profess their faith in Christ and be baptized. My faith was strengthened as I met with these candidates and heard their stories of coming to faith in Christ, and I trust your heart was encouraged as well as you witnessed their act of obedience.

A baptism is a glorious event in the life of the church and in the life of the person being baptized. I thought I would take this opportunity to answer some questions I've been asked over the years about what Baptists believe about this important practice.

Why do Christians practice baptism?

Christians practice baptism because Jesus was baptized, and he commanded his followers to baptize as well. Jesus' final words to his disciples, recorded in Matthew 28:19 are: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit....." In the Baptist tradition, baptism is considered an ordinance - something we do in obedience to the command of Christ.

Why don't Baptists baptize babies?

Since Baptists believe that baptism represents a commitment to follow Christ, we believe that baptism should be reserved for those who are old enough to make a mature profession of faith in Christ. This conforms to the New Testament pattern of people coming to faith in Christ and then being baptized.

Why do Baptists practice immersion (dunking people under the water) rather than sprinkling or pouring?

Baptism symbolizes dying to sin and rising to new life in Jesus Christ. Baptists believe that immersion captures that symbolism better than other modes of baptism.

Does baptism save us?

To this question, Baptists answer a resounding NO. God is the one who saves. When we trust Christ as our Savior, God forgives our sin and comes to dwell within us by His Holy Spirit. This inner transformation is the work of God. Baptists like to say that baptism is "an outward sign of an inward change." Baptism proclaims to the world: "I have decided to follow Jesus."

If you have questions about baptism or are interested in being baptized, please see me. I would love to talk with you more about this important step of obedience.

MABC FUNERAL POLICY

Church usage is subject to the approval of the Pastor.
The Pastor will advise the Worship, Facilities, and Hospitality Teams.

Member is defined in the Church Constitution

Member's immediate family, i.e.: husband, wife, and children. Mother, Father may be included in this policy as members.

Fees for use of the church and its facilities will be as follows:

Organist: Minimum of \$100 recommended

Sanctuary:

Inactive and non-members: \$100.00 for sanctuary use

Social Hall:

Inactive and non-members: \$100.00 for social hall use

Custodian:

Members, inactive, and non-members: \$50 custodial fee.

Note: The pastor does not charge a fee for funeral services. However, compensation for funeral services is not included in the pastor's salary. It is customary for the family to provide an honorarium for the pastor. Honorariums typically range between \$100 - \$200, but there is no expected amount. Funeral homes often include the honorarium as part of their overall costs; in cases where they do not it is appropriate to give the check directly to the pastor. Any questions or concerns about the honorarium can be discussed with the pastor.

Luncheons:

The church social hall may be used for funeral luncheons, upon request. However, the food, table service, and drinks would need to be provided by an outside caterer. Check with the church office for a list of local caterers. Arrangements with the caterer must be made by the family. Checks should be made to Michigan Avenue Baptist Church for above services rendered.

Note: Outside pastors and organists require approval by the pastor and/or Church Council.

WILLING RECIPIENTS

A young graduate longed for a certain sports car and knew his dad could afford it. So on the big day, he was infuriated to receive instead a leather-bound, embossed Bible. He threw it down and left for good.

Years later, after his father died, the son entered his father's study with sorrow and regret. A MOTHER'S PRAYER

A.T. Pierson writes that "all true prayer trusts God to give his own answer, not in our way or time, or even to our own expressed desire, but rather to his own unutterable groaning within us which he can interpret better than we."

As an example, Pierson points to Monica, the mother of the man who came to be known as Saint Augustine. Although Monica "pleaded with God that her dissolute son might not go to Rome, that sink of iniquity," he went anyway. While there, he met Ambrose, bishop of Milan, who led him to the Christian faith. Saint Augustine is considered one of the most important church fathers.

"God fulfilled the mother's desire while denying her request," Pierson writes. How might God be meeting your desires, even amid what appear to be unanswered prayers?



RESTORING THE BALANCE

In Springs in the Valley (Zondervan), pioneer missionary Lettie Cowman tells of a traveler making a trek through an African jungle. Native tribesmen who helped carry loads walked rapidly on the day one, covering a great distance. Yet the next morning they refused to move. When the frustrated traveler asked the tribesmen why they were just sitting, they said they'd gone too fast on the first day and "were now waiting for their souls to catch up to their bodies."

Cowman writes, "This whirling rushing life which so many of us live does for us what that march did for those tribesmen. The difference: They know they needed to restore life's balance; too often we do not."

God promises rest for our soul *and* body, so don't overlook the importance of physical restoration. Only by taking time to recharge can you be an effective laborer in God's kingdom.

"WHY DON'T STREETLAMPS HAVE EARS?"


"Mom!" my 3-year-old self hissed at 6:00 a.m. "Why don't streetlamps have ears?" My mom later wrote (in a 1974 article) that she peered at me sleepily, silently asking a question of her own: "Seriously?!"

That year I mused – and exasperated – my parents with countless questions: "Why did sister leave one shoe here and one there?" "If God is up in heaven, how did he make the grass?" Why are dandelions yellow?" To that query, Mom replied, "I guess that's how God wanted them" – and wrote, "In our house, we let God answer many of our questions."

I still have questions: Why is my dynamic young friend dying of cancer? Why are a parent's own children sometimes hard to love? How can we end war, poverty, sex trafficking? Should we donate money or save for college? How, exactly, does salvation work? Sometimes science or professionals are God's instruments to answer my questions. Sometimes answers come quietly to my heart – and sometimes they don't come at all.

Faith doesn't mean never questioning. It means trusting enough to ask, even when a question seems silly or pointless. Thanks, Mom and Dad, for teaching me by your loving example that God always welcomes my questions.




