OUR CHURCH VISION

Drawing upon its rich history of service to God in an urban setting, Michigan Avenue Baptist Church serves as a beacon of Christ-centered ministry to the community through witness, worship, and fellowship in a culturally diverse population.





On the first Easter morning, an angel told the women at the tomb, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples: **He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee.** There you will see him." (Matthew 28:5-7)

I'd like to focus on that phrase, "He...is going ahead of you." Just as Jesus went ahead of his disciples, so the risen Christ continues to go before us, leading and guiding us today. A few years ago, I read a sermon by Chuck Warnock, where he pointed out some of the ways Christ goes before us. Here's an adaptation of his list.

- **Jesus goes before us in good times.** Jesus' first miracle was at a wedding in Cana of Galilee. Jesus turned the water into wine, showing us that "God saves the best for last."
- **Jesus goes before us in times of fear and confusion.** When the disciples were caught in a storm on the sea, Jesus calmed the storm.
- Jesus goes before us in doubt. Jesus welcomed his disciple Thomas, despite his doubts and questions.
- Jesus goes before us when friends fail us. Jesus knew what it was like, not only to be attacked by enemies, but also to be abandoned by friends. Judas betrayed him; Peter denied him; and in the end, all the disciples "forsook him and fled." (Matthew 26:56)
- **Jesus goes before us in sorrow and death.** Jesus wept at the grave of his friend Lazarus, and then raised him to life. Jesus himself died an agonizing death on the cross. The writer of Hebrews reminds us that Jesus shared in our humanity "so that by his death he might destroy him who holds the power of death, that is the devil, and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death." (Hebrews 2:14-15)
- Jesus goes before us to heaven. Jesus told his followers, "I go to prepare a place for you, and if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." (John 14: 2-3) By his death and resurrection, Jesus conquered death and opened wide the doors of heaven.

This is the good news we celebrate on Easter and every day. Jesus Christ is risen! The living Christ goes before us in every situation and circumstance of our lives. May we boldly follow where He leads.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Are you looking for a way you might help around the church without making a major commitment such as serving on a team or becoming an officer? Here are some possibilities that would greatly help.

- 1. Coffee Service: Set up the coffee service for the social hour. This service is set up by 9:00 a.m. so that those attending Sunday School may use it, as well as those wishing a cup of coffee between Sunday School and church time. It just requires setting up the coffee urn and plugging it in, putting out cream, sugar, cups, spoons, napkins, etc. Someone else will take care of clean-up after church.
- 2. Door monitor: This requires sitting near the Adams Street entrance (top of stairs) to monitor individuals coming in after the start of service. This person should be comfortable approaching unknown individuals to determine whether they are coming in for the service or some other reason.
- 3. Worship in the Park: This person would help coordinate the summer Worship in the Park service as well as the picnic following.
- 4. Church Sign: This person would regularly change the messages on the sign in front of our building. Pastor Carol and/or church leaders would assist with appropriate messages.


