Dear Members and Friends,

I don't know about you, but I feel extra busy and stressed this time of the year. I talk with kids, parents, and grandparents who are up to their eyeballs with end of the school year activities. Many of us are looking forward to relaxing days this summer, but we're not quite there yet. Work and school and family concerns can at times seem overwhelming. As a high school student I was introduced to the following prayer, written by Rev. David Mains, which is especially helpful during stressful times.

Father, You are God, even in stress-filled times. On my own I could feel overwhelmed, but Scripture tells me that you care about every detail of my life. Right now, the stress I feel most intensely is ______. Show me the steps I can take, Lord, and give me the courage to take them. Calm my spirit, Lord, as I trust you to bring good in this situation.

Father, You are God, even in stress-filled times. This opening line acknowledges God's care – and that God's in charge – right from the start.

On my own I could feel overwhelmed, but Scripture tells me that You care about every detail of my life. I don't know what Rev. Mains was thinking of when he wrote these words, but perhaps he was remembering Jesus' teaching in Matthew 10:30 where Jesus reminds us that "the very hairs of your head are all numbered." God cares for us that much!

Right now, the stress I feel most intensely is______. Go ahead and fill in the blank. Maybe it's stress about final exams at school, worries about your job situation or a medical concern. Whatever is worrying you, whatever is keeping you awake at night, take it to God in prayer.

Show me the steps I can take Lord, and give me the courage to take them. There's no passive sitting around waiting for God to magically make our problems disappear. If there's action that we need to be taking, we pray that God would show us. And we trust God to give us the needed courage and strength to do what he asks.

Calm my spirit, Lord, as I trust you to bring good in this situation. The prayer closes with a final affirmation of God's goodness even in the midst of stressful situations.

AMEN

There's nothing magical about these words, but they do offer a possible starting point as we seek to bring our concerns to God in prayer. Whatever you face this week, may you sense God's presence and know his power as you trust in Him.

Dear Congregation

The human imagination is pretty incredible. World Relief Officer, Lisa Rothenberger-Winter states she met a farmer in Nicaragua last year named Luisa and heard her dreams for her family. Their lives have gotten harder as the rains come less frequently. When they do come, it's often in downpours, not in the gently falling rains that best nourish crops. Their life is hard, yet she pictures the future with imagines of her children grown up, going to college, being professionals, and caring for the Earth.

The human imagination is also limited, bound by our finite human experience. Sometimes the suffering of the world outpaces our ability to imagine new life.

For many, 2017 was an apocalyptic year filled with unbelievable hurricanes, earthquakes, fires, floods and violence. You prayed, stood with, and gave to people and needs from next-door neighbors to global neighbors you may never meet. As I write this letter in early February 2018, you have given over \$2 million to help the hundreds of thousands of people impacted by Hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Maria and mudslides and fires in California. These generous gifts help people envision recovery and new life, strengthened by the assurance that God is working in, through, and beyond us.

The same Apostle Paul who said that God is able to "accomplish abundantly more than we can ask or imagine" (Ephesians 3:20) also put the work of building abundance squarely at our feet:"...always seek to do good to one another and to all" (1 Thessalonians 5:15).

You have done good to one another and to all. When dreams abound and even when our imaginations run dry, you continue to do good. Your One Great Hour of Sharing gifts are living testimony to this. I offer thanks for your generous giving to One Great Hour of Sharing. Let us continue to be strengthened in the knowledge that God is able to "accomplish abundantly more than we can ask or imagine."

THE DANDELION





THE BEST FATHER

But God isn't just any father. Watson offers these reasons why God is "the Best Father":

- He is the most ancient (Daniel 7:9)
- He is perfect (Matthew 5:48)
- He is the wisest (Romans 16:27)
- He is the most loving (Zephaniah 3:17, 1 John 4:16)
- He has unsearchable riches (Ephesians 3:8)
- He can reform his children (Acts 9:11)
- He never dies (1 Timothy 6:16; Revelation 1:8).

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Are you looking for a way you might help around the church without making a major commitment such as serving on a team or becoming an officer? Here are some possibilities that would greatly help.

- 1. Coffee Service: Set up the coffee service for the social hour. This service is set up by 9:00 a.m. so that those attending Sunday School may use it, as well as those wishing a cup of coffee between Sunday School and church time. It just requires setting up the coffee urn and plugging it in, putting out cream, sugar, cups, spoons, napkins, etc. Someone else will take care of clean-up after church.
- Door monitor: This requires sitting near the Adams Street entrance (top of stairs) to monitor individuals coming in after the start of service. This person should be comfortable approaching unknown individuals to determine whether they are coming in for the service or some other reason.
- 3. Worship in the Park: This person would help coordinate the summer Worship in the Park service as well as the picnic following.
- 4. Prayer Chain: This person would be the primary contact for all prayer chain requests, ensuring that the request is passed on to the first person on both the day and night chains. This person would also update the list with new names and phone numbers, as needed, and distribute the list to participants.
