Dear members and friends,

Have you ever had the experience where a verse of Scripture just jumped out at you? That happened to me a few years ago with the Apostle Paul's prayer for the church in Ephesus. The prayer begins:

"I pray that from [God's] glorious, unlimited resources he will give you mighty inner strength through his Holy Spirit." (Ephesians 3: 16 NLT)

As I read, I was struck by the fact that God's resources are unlimited, and that God draws on those unlimited resources to provide the strength we need.

Some translations refer to God's "glorious, unlimited resources" as God's "riches in glory." I dusted off my Greek dictionary and discovered that there are at least thirteen references to God's riches in the New Testament. In all these passages, the word translated riches refers to "abundance, richness, valuable bestowment, plentiful supply of something, that which God or Christ possesses in boundless abundance." Take a minute to let that definition sink in - "plentiful supply, boundless abundance." Our God is a God of abundance.

God's resources are unlimited - that's in direct contrast to our resources which are definitely limited. Often we approach life from a position of scarcity. Our credit cards have spending limits that cannot be exceeded. Our bank accounts have a finite amount of money, and if we try to use more than we have, we are informed that we have insufficient funds. It's not only money that seems to be in short supply. Our time is limited; our energy is limited; our abilities to meet the challenges and tasks at hand are often limited. But where our resources are limited - God's are not.

God doesn't need to worry about running out of money, because he made it all and the whole world belongs to him. God doesn't need to worry about running out of time, because he is eternal. God doesn't need to worry about running short on energy, because he is the power that sustains the universe. God's resources are unlimited, and from those unlimited resources God generously supplies the mercy, grace and strength we need from day to day.

May you know the strength that comes from God's unlimited supply today and always.


16th-CENTURY GUIDANCE FOR TODAY

How can we know whether we're following God's will? Sometimes we act, only to see in hindsight that we caused harm. Or selfrighteousness blinds us to the good guidance of others.

St. Ignatius of Loyola pondered the difficulty of aligning our actions to God's ways. He taught the need for "discernment of spirits" examining internal thoughts and emotions to see if they originate with and lead to God. Ignatius called it "consolation" when he felt loved by God and eager to care for people in need, and "desolation" when something left him full of darkness and fear that moved him away from God and neighbor.

Think of a time you made a decision and then felt peaceful, full of light, convinced it was "right." And when have you done something despite feeling tangled in knots about it, and perhaps later felt worse? Life isn't always so clear-cut, but the more we practice discernment, the better we will recognize and follow God's will.


