Greetings as we enter our second month of worshipping together via an online format. Church council met (via Zoom videoconference) on Thursday, April 23 and voted to suspend in-person worship services and church activities through May 30. Church council will meet again (via Zoom videoconference) on May 14 to consider activities beyond May 30 and to begin putting a plan in place for when we are able to resume our in-person gatherings. It is likely that we will need to adjust a number of aspects of our worship service (like the passing of the peace, the children's message, and how we do communion), to help ensure people's health and safety.

As eager as we are to see one another and gather together to worship God, it is crucial that we resume our gatherings in a safe and responsible way. I am committed to moving forward in a way that is guided by the Spirit of God, authentic to who we are as a community of faith, and aligned with the recommendations of health officials and denominational leaders.

I want to applaud our Church Council for their wise leadership throughout this pandemic. I am grateful for the extra time they have invested and the ways they have mastered new technology to ensure that the mission and ministry of the church continues even while we are apart. I am also grateful for your continued involvement in and support of the church during these uncertain times.

Through all these changes our God remains the same. God is faithful. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. We can count on God to carry us through the uncertainty surrounding Covid-19. And we can trust God as we move into the future.

God has not changed, and our mission as a church has not changed. We are still called to love God, and to love people and introduce them to Jesus. Here are a few ways that we are continuing to reach out.


Our online worship services are continuing. Each week we are e-mailing a link to a prerecorded worship service (music, prayers, children's message, etc.) and a sermon, along




If you could use a listening ear and someone to pray with you, I'm happy to do that.

- Abundant peace in our relationships





My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my life and my portion forever.




