A Message from Pastor Carol

It's no secret that the pandemic has had a huge impact on churches. A few months ago, I came across an article by church consultant Karl Vaters. Vaters poses six questions for churches to be asking themselves in this historic moment. These questions really made me think. I believe these are exactly the kinds of questions we need to be asking ourselves as we move forward. His first two questions have to do with how well a congregation represents Jesus, both during lockdown and as we come out of lockdown and resume more in-person activities. Vaters writes:

The goal should never be to get more people in the building, or even to move ahead without causing conflict. It must always be "are we representing Jesus well as we move forward?"

A third question we must ask ourselves is "What have we learned and what are we still learning?" Vaters notes that there is much to be learned from this season of upheaval. We don't want to miss the lessons God is teaching us.

A fourth question to ponder is "How can we better serve the people at home?" Here's another quote that really struck me.

Don't criticize people who aren't ready to come back to church yet. Reach out to them. Lovingly, kindly and compassionately. Blessing people where *they* are is more important than getting them to show up where *we* are.

A fifth question to consider is "How well are we serving our online church members and visitors?" More and more people are connecting with the churches via technology, and that number is likely to grow in the future. I am grateful for the volunteers at MABC who are stepping up to help improve our online presence and we'll be looking for even more volunteers to serve in this area.

The final question Vaters poses is "How are people hurting and what can we do to help them?" Vaters notes that "People's problems will not be over when the pandemic ends." He foresees years of increased joblessness, homelessness, mental health challenges, etc. How will our church respond? Vaters offers this thought-provoking observation:

Whether people come back through our church doors is not the big issue. How we honor Jesus by reaching the hurting people outside our doors is what matters. I challenge you to ponder and pray about our answers to these questions, as we faithfully discern how to best be the church in these tumultuous times.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE

- ❖ Doors will open at 10:15. A greeter will open the door for you.

- ❖ Because it's difficult to sing while wearing masks, we're going to avoid congregational singing and focus on instrumental and solo pieces.
- ❖ We will share the peace of Christ from our seats using a touchless greeting.

- ❖ You may mail your offering to 203 S. Michigan Ave. Saginaw, MI 48602
- On the first Sunday of the month, communion is available in prepackaged cups. You will be given one as you arrive.
- Drop your used communion cup in the waste basket by the door as you exit.
- You will be dismissed by rows.
- Feel free to linger in the parking lot and visit while observing social distancing.




Older Women Take Note!
