a Message From Pastor Carol

Dear Members and Friends,

We're beginning the second month of our quest to read through the Bible in a year. If you have been following along with the suggested readings, by the time you get this newsletter you will have read the books of Genesis, Mark and Galatians. Congratulations. You are off to a great start. If you haven't been reading along with us, it's not too late to begin. You can download a copy of the reading plan by clicking HERE, or call the church office and we will send one to you.

Some people see the Bible as a rule book, with hard and fast rules to follow. Others see it as an instruction manual for life, with lots of helpful advice. Still others look to the Bible as a source for daily inspiration. In truth, the Bible is all these things and more.

The Bible is a library or a collection of books. The sixty-six different books that make up the Bible were written by different people in different times and even in different languages— Hebrew, Greek, and a smattering of Aramaic. The Bible has many types of writing. It includes historical narratives, laws, poetry, prophecy, and letters, and more.

Yet for all its breadth, the Bible also has unity. In some ways, the Bible is God's great love letter to us. Melody Wilson Shobe puts it this way:

"[The Bible] is the story of God's extraordinary love that overflowed into the creation of the world, the earth, and all that is in it, including humanity. It is the story of God's relentless, unwavering, unstoppable love for his people—people who are flawed and funny and ordinary, just like you and me. It is a story of the journey of those all-too-ordinary people who have tried ... to respond to God's love. It is the story of how God keeps trying to call us back to him even when we have wandered and strayed from God's path. It's the story of how, in the fullness of time, God came among us, love incarnate, in the person of Jesus Christ, to show us how to walk through this world with love and compassion. It's the story of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. It's the story of the founding of the Church, the followers of Jesus in the world, the people of the Way, proclaiming Christ's word and continuing his work. It's the story of you and me, the descendants of these flawed, broken, and beautiful characters, the inheritors of the promises of God."

Blessings as you continue to read God's Word.
