A Message From Pastor Carol



Dear Members and Friends:

As we read through the Bible this year, we have been reading about the Israelites as they journeyed through the wilderness on their way to the Promised Land. After they sinned grievously by worshipping a golden calf, the LORD revealed Himself to Moses.

In Exodus 34:6-7, [God] passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, "The LORD, the LORD, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness; maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin. Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished; he punishes the children and their children for the sin of the parents to the third and fourth generation."

This is one of the most important, and oft-repeated, verses in the Bible. King David prayed: "But you, O Lord, are a compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger and abounding in love and faithfulness." The prophet Joel said, "Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love." Jonah said the same thing, when he complained about God's mercy to Nineveh: "I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love. The words that God first spoke to Moses became Israel's confession of faith. When anyone wanted to know who God is what God is like, they answered: "The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness...."

Philip Ryken does an outstanding job of unpacking these attributes of God in his commentary on the book of Exodus: Saved for God's Glory. Here's an abbreviated version of his insights. First on the list of God's attributes is compassion. Compassion has to do with God's ability to empathize with us, his finite creatures. Psalm 103 reminds us that "As a Father has compassion on his children, so the Lord has compassion on those who fear Him." God's heart beats with fatherly care for us.

"The Lord is also gracious. This is a word of mercy or undeserved favor. People often say they want God to give them what they deserve. If God were to do that, we would all perish in our sins. But God does something better. Rather than giving us what we deserve, he gives us something we don't deserve: The free gift of his grace. Salvation is not based on any merit of our own, but only on God's desire to show mercy." (Ryken)

Next, God says he is *slow to anger*. The phrase "slow to anger" literally means "long-nosed." Now you may be wondering, what does having a long nose have to do with patience? When cartoonists want to portray an angry person or animal they show steam coming out of its ears and out of its nostrils. So if someone is said to be long-nosed, it takes a long time for the steam to come out. God does sometimes get angry, but God doesn't fly off the handle in rage. As Philip Ryken says: "When God acts against evil, he does so righteously and deliberately, not because he loses his temper." God is willing to wait to give people time to repent and return to him.

In the words of 2 Peter 3:9: God is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance."

The compassionate, gracious, and long-suffering God abounds in "love and faithfulness." The word translated love is the Hebrew word chesed. It's sometimes translated as loving-kindness or steadfast love. It's paired with the word faithfulness, referencing God's commitment to keep God's promises. "God's love is loyal and steadfast. Since he never goes back on a promise, once God promises to love, he keeps on loving. And his love is boundless. It is love without measure and love beyond degree." (Ryken)

Finally, God is forgiving. The Bible explicitly says that God forgives wickedness, rebellion, and sin. These were the three main categories of sin in the OT. "The point is that God is willing to forgive any and all kinds of sin." (Ryken)

We might be tempted to stop reading right here - with this long list of attributes of God we like to praise. But God, speaking to Moses, continues his self-revelation: "Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished; he punishes the children and their children for the sin of the parents to the third and fourth generation." And here we have a tension: God forgives sin, and God punishes sin. These final phrases have to do with God's justice and God's holiness. God is a forgiving God, but "God does not neglect just judgement." (Freitheim) Sin is serious. God is not an overly indulgent grandparent who turns a blind eye to sin. God is not indifferent to sin and its dreadful consequences. This is ultimately good news. Because God is a just judge, sin, death, and evil do not have the final word. God wins. God judges sin, and yet God's judgment is tempered by his mercy.

The verse says that God punishes the sin of the parents to the third and fourth generation. This has to do with the lingering effects of sin...and the way it impacts the entire family. It's no secret that abusive, dysfunctional patterns of behavior can get passed on from one generation to the next. But here's the thing. The punishment extends for three or four generations. How far does God's mercy extend? To a thousand generations. The scales are tipped far, far, far on the side of mercy.

God's mercy and justice meet at the cross, where God himself, in the person of Jesus, absorbed the pain and death caused by human sin. In this Lenten season may we rejoice in God's mercy, compassion and forgiveness.
