The book of Judges contains a wonderful story about a man named Gideon. We first meet Gideon threshing his wheat in a winepress to try to hide it from the Midianite invaders who were plaguing Israel at that time. An angel of the Lord came to Gideon as he was hiding out from the Midianites and said: "The Lord is with you mighty Warrior." Gideon must have wondered, "Who, me?" There seems to be more than a little bit of divine humor, divine irony, in the angel's greeting. The angel calls Gideon a mighty warrior....when at the moment, he seems to be anything but mighty.

The important thing to notice here is that God sees Gideon, not just for who he is, but for who he can become. When God looks at Gideon, God doesn't just see a timid man hiding in a winepress, God sees a mighty warrior who can lead his people to victory against the Midianites. God sees the kind of leader Gideon will become. That's an important lesson for us to remember too. When God calls us to serve him, he doesn't just see who we are now, he sees the person we will become, with his help and in his power.

In response, Gideon says what must have been on the minds of many Israelites at that time. "If the Lord is with us, why has all this happened to us?" Gideon wanted to know why this calamity (the Midianite invasion) had befallen Israel. He felt abandoned by God. He wanted to know where God was and what God was doing about this situation.

And God responds to Gideon, though probably not in the way that Gideon expected. God tells Gideon, "Go in the strength you have and save Israel out of Midian's hand. Am I not sending YOU!"

God basically says, "Gideon: I am calling you to be a big part of the solution to this problem."

God often calls us to be a big part of the solution to the troubles we see around us.

Gideon cried out to God: "Why aren't you doing anything about the Midianites oppressing us?" God said: "I am doing something about it. I am sending YOU!"

I think it is safe to say that this was not what Gideon wanted to hear. Gideon wanted God to do something miraculous to get them out of the mess that Israel was in.

And God was indeed going to deliver Israel in a marvelous way. But God was going to accomplish that deliverance by using a very ordinary man named Gideon.

Because isn't that how God often works? God uses ordinary people to do extraordinary things. God has just called this frightened farmer named Gideon to deliver the Israelites from the Midianites.

But Gideon isn't sure that he is up to the task. So he replies to God: But Lord, How can I save Israel? My clan is the weakest in Manasseh, and I am the least in my family.

When faced with God's call to lead the Israelites, Gideon starts listing all the reasons why he can't. My clan is the weakest, I am the least.... But as one commentator put it, "What Gideon does not seem to realize, but will have further opportunity to learn, is that being "weakest" and "least" is no problem with God."

Think about the apostle Paul's words in I Corinthians 1:26 where he says, Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong. God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God.

God specializes in taking ordinary, everyday people and using them in mighty ways for his glory. God's promise to us today is the same as it was to Gideon. When Gideon got done listing all the reasons he wasn't the best person for the job...God said, I will be with you. That's the promise God made to Gideon and to Moses and to all the saints of old. That's the promise Jesus made to his disciples when he gave them the great commission: Go and make disciples of all nations....and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the age. And that's the promise that God gives to us in the work God sets before us. No matter how uncertain the future before, no matter how inadequate we may feel for the tasks, God promises to be with us always. And that promise is always enough.
